Sunday Masses

Registration for Sunday Masses opens on Tuesdays at midday. The link to register is: www.pndiocese.org.nz/mass-bookings. Registrations will close at 1:00pm on Friday. Should you not be able to register online please contact the Parish Office when registrations are open.

Diocesan requirements for use of the Churches at Alert Level 2 include:

- A maximum of 100 parishioners with 2 metres social distancing between each bubble.
- The wearing of masks is recommended while in the Church.
- People entering the Church must sign in using the Covid 19 tracer app or use the sign in sheets provided on the tables in the foyer of the Church.
